I recently listened to a podcast where a woman recounted a family hike up Mount Katahdin in Maine's Baxter State Park. This mountain marks the end of the Appalachian Trail, a nearly 2,200-mile journey stretching from Georgia to Maine. As they approached the summit, she noticed two types of hikers finishing their trek—one who had completed the trail in 172 days straight and two older men who had taken 45 years to finish it in sections.

Their journeys were vastly different, yet they arrived at the same destination. One took an intense, focused approach, while the others made steady progress over decades. Both required commitment, just in different ways. This reminded me that life isn't about following the same path as others—it's about finding the way that works for us. When asked what they learned from their journeys, the hikers shared some valuable lessons that I thought we could apply to our everyday lives.

- **Patience is invaluable** In a world of instant gratification, we're reminded that the most meaningful things take time.
- **Keep moving forward** It's easy to feel stuck, whether in negative thoughts or unhelpful habits. Even small steps forward lead to progress so just keep going!
- Nature is healing Luckily, we live in Hawaii—let's embrace the natural beauty around us.
- It's never too late Age and circumstances may change, but new goals remain within reach. What we believe shapes our reality.
- **People are inherently good** The hikers experienced countless acts of kindness along the way, proof that generosity and compassion are everywhere.

As we step into spring, let's reflect on our own journeys and be encouraged that, no matter what the pace or path, progress is always possible. Thank you, as always, for being such a valued part of our `ohana.
